## CONGRATULATIONS AL MATTHEWS Recipient of The Order of the Long Leaf Pine Award

Albert "Al" Matthews, our first ever Town Manager received this prestigious award on Monday January 28th during a luncheon held in his honor at the Maggie Valley Town Pavilion. Surrounded by family and friends, he was presented with the award by Senator Kevin Corbin.

Al began his lustrous career with Maggie Valley as it's first Town Manager on August 31, 1978, just four years after we incorporated. He is the longest serving Town Manager in the state, serving 22 years just in Maggie.

During that time he over saw Highway widening, installation of side walks running the entire length of town. He was integral to the establishment of the sewer system including the treatment plant, a full time dedicated police department, street lights and planning and zoning, and the passing of numerous code of ordinances. He was a state certified Volunteer Firefighter and is currently serving his third term on the board of directors. He drafted legislation for the Town to conduct a referendum for an ABC store, mixed beverages, beer and wine sales and currently is serving his second term on the ABC board. This is just what he did for Maggie Valley! He also served the Town of Canton as clerk, and assistant manager.

It is the highest award for state service granted by the Office of the Governor, and nominations can be made for individuals with 30 years or more of service to the State of NC. Our new storage building is almost complete! Two years ago, our Public Works Director Mike Mehaffey, went on a search to find a plot of land in Town to put a storage building. We



are now 95% complete, with most of the work being done by our own Public Works guys, including plumbing, electrical and insulation. The only work hired out was the concrete slab, installing the roll up doors and the building shell itself. Currently the guys are working on interior walls for bathrooms and racks for storage. We are just waiting on our final inspection. This building will be used for summer time storage of Town winter decorations and winter time storage of Town mowing equipment. The best part is all the storage fees this will save our Town and no debit was created to build.
